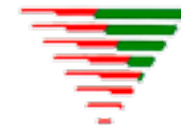

DIPLOMA OF SPECIALISED BOWEN THERAPY

This course consists of two areas of study:

- Enterprise Units presenting specialised Bowen Therapy procedures; and
- Training Package Units of material essential to all professional therapists. This Diploma course builds upon the Certificate IV in Bowen Therapy (see separate Brochure).

Diploma Enterprise Units

Pre-requisites: Certificate IV in Bowen Therapy

Requirements: Five modules which must be completed in sequential order

Mode: Classroom training over a 12 month period consisting of three days (24 classroom hours) for each Module

Delivery Strategy: Modular format to cover content of course

Review: Each module will include review of material studied in previous modules

Assessment:

- Practical and Written Assessment: during Module 12
- Ten case studies of 3 sessions each
- Professional Skills Tasks:
A - Log Book for Diploma: recording practical experience of 150 hours of treatments outside of class using clinical assessments, specialised skills and rehabilitation.
- B - Professional Reflection: a written task reflecting upon your own practice ethics and industry developments

Module 8

- Clinical assessment skills for the lumbar spine, pelvis, hip and lower limb
- Specialised procedures for lower back, hip pain, knee, bladder and prostate problems
- Fascia our natural communication system
- Embryology and our original blue print
- Handy hints, related body systems

Module 9

- Clinical assessment skills for the hip, lower limb, thoracic spine and neck
- Specialised procedures for upper thoracic tension, chronic neck pain, additional procedures for jaw, sinus, pregnancy, lower limb, knee, strapping and foot stretch
